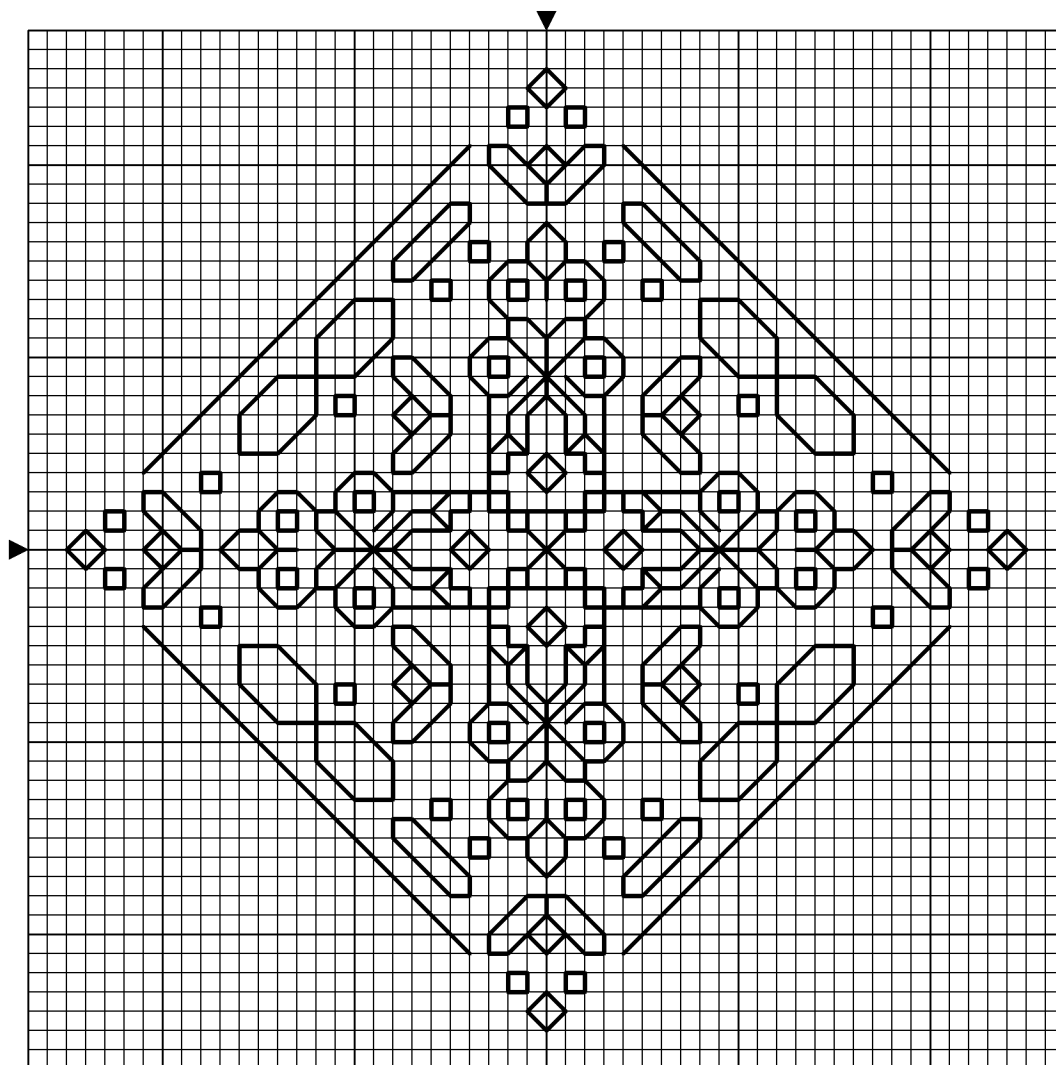

L I N E N F L O W E R S

Design size: 50 w x 50 h.
Use 1 strand for Backstitching.
Finished size: 2 3/4" square on 25 ct. Linen.
Backstitch Color: DMC Floss 553. (Or use your favorite Hand-dyed Floss Color).





This design was finished as a square pillow with side cotton fabric prints of Lavender and Purple.

To begin, cut 4 (3 x 6") cotton prints (if using 25 ct. fabric).

*Your length (6") could be longer or shorter depending on the cross stitch fabric count used. When centered, your cotton fabric should hang over each finished border side approx. 1 1/2".

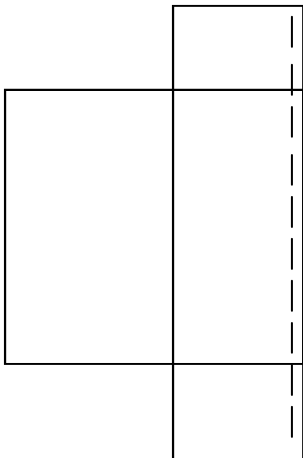
You will also need a backing square of a cotton print to match. (This size will be determined by the finished size of front piece).

Directions:

1. Press cross stitch and all fabric pieces.

2. First, with a quilting ruler and rotary cutter, on the cross stitch fabric, cut off 1" on each side from each cross stitch border. (The purple line at the outside of the design).

3. Center 1 edge of fabric length over cut edge of finished cross stitch. (Right sides together). The bulk of your fabric will be lying over the finished cross stitch. Sew hem with a 1/2" seam.



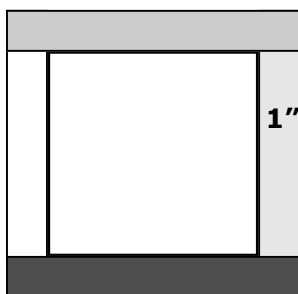
Flip strip right side out and finger press. Turn over and trim off excess evenly.

Repeat with each strip, centering each strip over cross stitch material rather than completed xst and sewn strips. At this point, don't worry about cotton fabric edges too much.

4. When all 4 strips are sewn on, lay out flat, right side up.

Lay ruler on seam side between cross stitch fabric and sewing fabric. Trim sewing fabric off to 1".

Repeat for each side.



5. Measure completed top piece and cut a backing fabric the same size. Sew, right sides together, on 3 sides. Turn right side out, stuff lightly with fiberfill, and handsew edge seams together with matching thread.

If desired, sew braided cord around pillow with a loop at top.
